

Vaccination and Fertility Treatment

Currently, only the Comirnaty Vaccine from Pfizer/Biontech is approved in Denmark and on which our FAQs are based. We will try to update as soon as possible when other vaccines are approved.

FAQ

Should I wait with fertility treatment until after I have been vaccinated?

The Danish State Serum Institute (SSI) does not recommend waiting for pregnancy after vaccination is completed, i.e. after 2nd vaccination (1).

Can I get vaccinated when I have already started fertility treatment?

No specific data are available for this. Any pregnancy which is discovered after 1st vaccination is also recommended not to be discontinued (1). However, you should preferably be able to receive 2nd vaccination before pregnancy.

Can I get the vaccine when I get pregnant after fertility treatment?

Although the currently available data do not indicate an increased risk to the pregnant woman or to pregnancy, there is currently insufficient evidence to recommend the use of covid-19 vaccines during pregnancy. Vaccination of pregnant women should only be considered if the potential benefits outweigh the potential risks to mother and child (1). This is the current advice in Denmark, but please check in your own country what the local advice is.

What do the professional societies say about vaccination and fertility treatment?

The Danish Fertility Society and the European Fertility Society (ESHRE) have not yet made a statement. The US Society ASRM recommends vaccination both before fertility treatment, while receiving fertility treatment as well as during pregnancy (2).
